When asked about Dalcroze Method, many of us think that it is a method used for children, bouncing balls and walking in circles and mostly about dance. How accurate are these thoughts?

Developed by Emile Jaques-Dalcroze, a Swiss composer, music educator and music theorist, the Dalcroze Method is based on teaching all elements of music through movement. This method is used to foster music appreciation, ear-training and improvisation while improving musical abilities.

## How does Dalcroze Eurhythmics benefit students and teachers?

One may question, "How does this method benefit students and teachers?" In an article written by Timothy Caldwell, he said that, "The true significance of this method is that it combines all the senses through the primary learning sense, kinesthesia, and directly affects the emotions and perceptions of both the teacher and student." The method focuses on allowing the student to gain physical awareness and experience of music through training that takes place through all of the senses, particularly kinesthetic. Using the body as the main instrument, the mind, the ear and the emotions are engaged in the learning process.

As we move forward in our music education journey, let us expand our pedagogical repertoire that would promote active learning and enhance our interactive learning environment.
