Tip of the Month

This month, we introduced the *Orff Approach to Music Education* as one of the specialised music pedagogies for the classroom. The Orff approach is about engaging pupils through improvisation, play and movement. It was introduced by Carl Orff (1895-1982) whose ideal about music education was "experience first, then intellectualize".

One simple improvisation strategy is to use "Call and Response". The teacher can play or sing a passage and his/her students "answer" the phrase. They could respond in different variations: echoing the same phrase back; echoing the same phrase at a higher or lower pitch or altering a few of the notes; or singing/playing something entirely different. The children could take turns with their response. This encourages children to develop their ears and ability to improvise. It's fun too!
