STAR-POST (Music)

Dear Colleagues,

Hope that you all have had a good start to the new year! At this time when our lessons begin to gain momentum, we ask ourselves a fundamental question:

What are some key pedagogical considerations that would enhance the learning of our children and generate a successful, productive musical experience for them?

When we observe how children perceive and participate in musical activities, we can better nurture their growth as musicians. A very important key is to know our children and their cognitive and physical developmental levels. We can create a physical environment that stimulates and increases their involvement and enhances their learning.

Tap on their prior knowledge, and involve them in discovering new knowledge through learning experiences. Empower the child to learn by inviting their input as it gives ownership to the learning experience as well as feedback to the teacher on the child's understanding of music skills and concepts.

Use a wide range of involvement strategies that cater to diverse learning styles -- visual, auditory, kinaesthetic (movement), tactile (use of puppets and other manipulative), analytical, creative, and descriptive. Children who are involved visually, aurally, and kinaesthetically in the music-making process often have a higher perception of musical events, stronger comprehension of music concepts, and are better able to communicate their understanding of music than those who are less involved.

Check for the child's understanding of a concept or skill. Restate, clarify and elaborate to enhance their understanding. Use recall questions, comprehension questions, games, and your own aural and visual assessment of the child as he or she participates in various music activities.
